

# Flea Checklist

You do need to understand that fleas are a transported insect. You can become infested again. If you or your pet come in contact with another pet that is infested with fleas, they could be transported home again on you or your pet.



1. Wash All Clothing, Rugs, all Bedding ( including dust ruffles ), Furniture cushions that have zippers. Then place all items in plastic bags and keep them 4 feet or higher off the floor.
2. Remove all miscellaneous items from the floors in all rooms, closet floors, under beds, under dressers, and under furniture. Pull furniture away from walls about 1 foot.
3. Wash or dispose of all pet bedding.
4. Wash or vacuum all floors. Buy a flea collar, cut it in half and put one section in your vacuum bag. While you vacuum it will kill any fleas it picks up. In 2 weeks, put the other half of the collar in a new bag and vacuum again.
5. Vacuum under all furniture.
6. Cover any infant beds with a sheet then launder after treatment.
7. Cover any fish tanks and supplies. Unplug pumps.
8. In the kitchen put away all food, dishes, pots and pans, coffee pots, miscellaneous items. clean all counters after treatment. In bathroom put away all toothbrushes, miscellaneous items. clean counters after treatment.
9. Pet should be taken to be de-fleaed professionally and not brought back until treatment is done.
10. Service technician will do a walk thru before your service to make sure necessary preparations for treatment has been completed so they can proceed.
11. All people and pets need to be out of the house for 4-6 hours for our product to dry.
12. It is normal to see some fleas in the treated area for a few days.
